The goal for the summer is to raise \$6000 so they can start a 5th grade classroom. This will be the mission that all of the RLCA camp sessions partner with for 2019 and the mission theme for 2019 will be the "Great Commission of Christ."

- Replaced stator, front main seal, and hydro belt on Exmark.
- Replaced tie rod on John Deere riding mower.
- Drained and flushed water heaters in White Pine and Blue Spruce.
- Kimberling Hall: Removed electrical wiring. Removed unnecessary materials from first floor. Added cable to tie second floor framing back together.
- Winterized Schrader and Hall Cottages, Family Campground bathrooms, staff housing, Raum Hall and Family Campground.
- Removed exterior access panel. Removed wet fiberglass insulation. Tightened bolt in logs. Dried out cavity and replaced fiberglass insulation with closed cell foam on White Pine

Nov 19, 2018

- Replaced underground shut off valve for Hare and Schrader, winterized Hare and Maple Cottages, winterized and covered waterfall, winterized Dickenson 1 and Dining Hall.
- Patched rotted area in White Pine log with epoxy. Tightened bolts on logs on east side of C pod and installed closed cell insulation.

 Tyvek over expose exterior sheeting. Finished framing first floor interior walls. Cut stringers. Installed
 second floor subfloor. Installed stair risers and treads. Worked on leveling up the 1st floor. Framed
 second floor rooms. Multiple days with Ferris Church of Christ work group.
- Installed pressure relief valve on boiler at Director's Residence.
- Attended Christian Camp Leaders Conference in Branson, MO. Toured High Hill Christian Camp in High Hill, MO.

 Also changed incandescent lights to LED. Researched changing fluorescent fixtures to LED however since ours are T12 ballast don't match up with the bulbs that they have for the program
- Kimberling Hall: Fabricated tapered floor support to level first floor. Met with HVAC installers for proposal of HVAC installation.

Family Campground Committee's Report

According to the historical timeline researched by Hazel Williams, the Family Camp Club was established in 1976. Since its beginning it has been an important part of the facilities and program of Rock Lake Christian Assembly. In accordance with RLCA's mission statement, the campground provides a camping area "removed from worldly distractions, which will develop current and future disciples to serve their congregations and grow in the kingdom of Christ."

The Family Campground Committee met to review and update the campground handbook and the Family Campground User Agreement on February 9, 2019. The committee consisted of Rich Maxwell (chairman), Luke Essex, Karen Campbell, and Debbie Burt. A few minor changes were made. The summer user fee will be for May 1-Oct. 15. The fee of \$550 was not changed. Winter storage was changed from October 16-April 30 and the winter fee of \$100 was also not changed.

There was a lot of discussion about how to keep the campground and the service building (Raum Hall), neat and clean, especially since a lot of visitors were expected for the camp's 100th anniversary. Those using the campground will be encouraged to do their part and work with the camp staff.

There is a total of 58 sites in the campground. 43 sites were rented for the entire 2019 season. 29 sites were used for 2018-2019 winter storage. During the summer the campground is often at or near capacity. People utilize the campground when serving as faculty or participating in a program, when volunteering around the camp, or to just have a place to stay with a Christian atmosphere. Every night there is usually a campfire when people can gather and fellowship with other Christians.

The Family Campground provides a significant source of financial support for RLCA. This year, the total received in campground fees was \$25,946.

Property Development Committee's Report

This year has seen a lot of improvement around the property. The winter months involved multiple workdays with the Ferris Church of Christ work group at Kimberling Hall. Kimberling Hall renovations included installing new beam to change the layout to have a larger conference area on the lake side, framing upstairs to create larger bedrooms, adding tapered flooring support on the first floor to level the floor, adding subfloor, metal roofing installed, installing multiple new windows, and installing siding. The Tabernacle had a metal roof installed. The new addition of 15.2 acres started being prepared for new fencing, multiple trees were cut down for the fence line along the east property line. A circle concrete pad was added around the campfire pit this helped eliminate moving of benches while mowing and had the added bonus it helped with mosquitos. White Pine was washed and stained.

RLCA has the need for additional space. Camp programming is reaching capacity, year-round schools is a possibility, and our off-season retreats are maxing out our current winterized space. Hence, the Property Development committee started working on a proposal for a new building to meet the needs for the future of RLCA, such as a large meeting area for larger groups to include our current lodges and the additional beds this building and dining space. The staff visited multiple other camps to see how they utilized their multi-purpose buildings. There were many things that we were able to learn from these trips. Tony Russell, Tim St. Louis and Luke Essex spent many hours working on initial concept plans for the future building to try to implement the needs as well as the wants. The committee met and made some suggestions and the Board approved to move forward. The architect is currently working on updating our concept to implement building code requirements.


